Keynote Speakers:



Vincent Felitti, M.D.

Dr. Vincent Felitti is one of the world's foremost experts on childhood trauma. Leading the charge in research into how adverse childhood experiences affect adults, he is co-principal investigator of the internationally recognized Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) Study, a long-term, in-depth, analysis of over 17,000 adults. Defying conventional belief, this study revealed a powerful relationship between our emotional experiences as children and our physical and mental health as adults. Dr. Felitti will share the background and findings of the original ACE Study as well as updates on the current work being done with ACEs.



Jim Sporleder

With 33 year's experience as an educator and principal of Lincoln High School in Walla, Walla, Washington, Jim's leadership led Lincoln to become a "Trauma Informed" school, gaining national attention due to a dramatic drop in out of school suspensions, increased graduation rates and the number of students going on to post-secondary education. These dramatic changes at Lincoln were documented and made into the movie *Paper Tigers*, which tells the Lincoln Story. Jim will share the transformation that Lincoln High School experienced when they let go of their traditional approach to student discipline and implemented a trauma response approach.



Furhut Janssen, D.O.

As an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at Central Michigan University, and the Psychiatry Residency Program Director, Dr. Furhut Janssen is passionate about addressing childhood trauma and promoting resiliency. Her presentation will address the importance of resiliency as a response to childhood trauma in light of the ACEs study, identify resources in the community to promote resiliency, and help recognize opportunities to build resiliency in children in a variety of disciplines.
